

Emergency Bag to Be Provided

Here is an introduction to helpful emergency goods carefully selected to be provided for the residents in anticipation of their post-disaster lives in the condominium. Since the waterproof emergency bag has some extra room, you can add necessary goods for your family to the provided goods to create an original bag of emergency goods.



Backpack-style widemouthed water bag

This water bag is easy to carry even when the elevator is out of service. Since it is in a backpack style, you can keep your hands free.



LED flashlight with NOPOPO water-powered batteries

This flashlight is designed to be used as a room light in the event of emergencies. It consumes only a small amount of power, so it works for a long time.

Storage period :
Storable for a long term (below 20 years)



Emergency radio ECO-3

A radio is indispensable for collecting information in the event of emergencies. This radio also has a USB port, an LED light and other functions.

Storage period :
The condenser will last 10 years.



Amino Area Body Cleansing Water (Dry shampoo)

This cleanser can be used to wash your whole body, including your hands, fingers, and your hair. Since it does not have to be rinsed, you can use it even when no supply water is available.

Storage period : 10 years



Dental wipes

Dental wipes substitute for a toothbrush and toothpaste to prevent pneumonia and infectious diseases caused by lack of dental hygiene even when water is unavailable.



Mylet mini-10

This is a set of toilet bags and a coagulant with strong antimicrobial and deodorant effects. It is easy to dispose of after use.

Storage period :
10 years (duration of the coagulant's antimicrobial and deodorant effects)



Ofuro-desuyo

This is a pack of large wipes, which are very helpful when you cannot bathe. You can wipe your whole body clean only with a wipe.

Storage period :
5 years (when the pack is not opened)

Useful emergency goods, which would make you feel secure

Below is a list of useful emergency goods recommended to the residents based on the views of people affected by past disasters. These items will help you continue living in your housing unit even after a disaster occurs. Prepare against disasters by keeping stocks of the listed goods in consideration of the composition of your family, the suitability of items for use in usual situations, and their versatility.

Household goods

Anticipate the suspension of lifelines and prepare cleaning tools, which you will use to clean up your housing unit after a disaster occurs.

- Lanterns**
(non-combustion type, working on batteries or rechargeable with solar power panels)
- Headlamps**
(helpful for keeping your hands free for work during power failures)
- Batteries**
(manganese or long-storable alkaline batteries)
- Mobile batteries**
(ones you use usually)
- Newspaper**
(as a substitute for dishes, first aid goods, or an absorbent for toilet bags)
- Garbage bags**
(as a substitute for buckets or toilet bags)
- Rain ponchos**
(used for protection against rain, the cold or dust, or at the time of breast-feeding or changing clothes)
- Cloth packing tape**
(used to fix broken items)
- Adhesive cleaning rollers, brooms and dustpans**
(used to remove scraps)
- Cotton work gloves or leather gloves**
(used to clear scraps or keep out the cold)
- Padlocks and chains**
(used when the entrance door is deformed and cannot be locked)

Kitchen goods

Together with water and emergency food, kitchen goods create a sufficient environment for refrigeration and cooking.

- Drinking water**
(number of family members × 2 to 3 liters)
- Emergency food**
(dried food, freeze-dried food, and retort-pouch food)
- Soft food, such as rice porridge**
(for the elderly)
- Portable stove and gas cylinder**
(A gas cylinder expires in about seven years.)
- Plastic wrap and aluminum foil**
(spread on dishes when water supply is suspended)
- Plastic bags**
(used to warm food in hot water)
- Refrigerants for outdoor use**
(stored in the refrigerator and placed on food during power failures)
- Cooler box**
- Disposable nursing bottle**

Hygienic and first aid goods

Prepare goods for your regular use or ones that match your skin or physical makeup.

- Household medicines**
(together with your drug history handbook and prescriptions)
- First aid kit**
(gauze, adhesive bandages, bandages, poultices, etc.)
- Hand sterilizer**
(used to clean your hands when water supply is suspended)
- Toilet bags**
(number of family members × 5 times × 7 days)
- Large handkerchiefs**
(used for first aid or as a substitute for masks)
- Masks, including ones of kids' size**
(used to avoid dust or infections)
- Sanitary napkins and breast milk pads**
- Diapers**
(for the elderly and infants)
- Spare glasses, including reading glasses**
- Disposable pocket warmers**
- Insect repellent goods**
(such as mosquito coils for summer)
